















Staff Musings

Conserve

Fungi on a fallen tree on a 104-acre tract of forested land, owned by Joan Byrd and George Rector. The Jackson County couple placed the property under conservation easement in 2014. It borders the Nantahala National Forest and protects views seen from the Blue Ridge Parkway.

Connect

For a second year in a row, LTLT and its partner, Coweeta Hydrologic Laboratory, had full attendance at the Landowner Roads Workshop, a one-day course designed to train landowners on proper ways to plan, construct and maintain private-access roads.

This event is a stepping-stone to a larger comprehensive training program for local grading contractors and developers called Mountain H2Opro, organized by the Regional Erosion and Sediment Control Initiative (RESCI). RESCI is a partnership between LTLT and five other WNC groups. The Mountain H2Opro program will provide regular and affordable courses on erosion and sediment control to grading contractors and developers, thus reducing sediment, a pollutant that threatens the rich aquatic diversity of the water basins in LTLT's region.
