
One of Mainspring's projects in 2015 was especially personal for me. In my 15 years with the land trust, I've sat across the kitchen table from many families and helped them consider and realize their dreams of leaving a legacy of land. Their lands may be valued for their farm soils, rich cove forests, rushing streams, or as lands that make up the unspoiled mountain views that we all enjoy and tend to take for granted. This year, I sat with my husband on the opposite side of the table, as we donated a conservation easement on our own Roper Knob property.

It wasn't easy. In fact, I was surprised how it felt to be the easement donor rather than the land trust staff member. Like so many others, our family land is our most valuable asset. George and I struggled with "giving up" the value of our land's potential for big-view development. We struggled with "forever" and its many unknowns. We struggled with the decision, even though we knew we wanted to leave an undeveloped Roper Knob—which forms a prominent view throughout northern Macon County—as part of our legacy.

The process gave me a new appreciation for all of the families that have made that important choice. I am proud to be one of them now and proud our acreage is now included in the "Private Land Easements" on page 5 of this Annual Report. And I am proud to honor you — who lend your support and put your confidence in Mainspring year after year — with this foreverprotected view of Roper Knob.

WHEN MAINSPRING FIRST PURCHASED property on Lakey Creek in Macon County in 2011, a culvert carrying the creek under a road was quickly identified as a barrier to fish movement. "Fish could pass downstream through the culvert, but only the strongest could swim back upstream," says Mainspring's Jason Meador. Culverts are not a permanent solution and rains were already causing the road going over the culvert to slump.

Fast-forward to 2015, when the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission funded a more permanent and fish-friendly solution. With coordination from Mainspring, a steel bridge was completed that provides the family with a long-term solution for accessing their home. In addition to removing the culvert, Mainspring added habitat for fish to rest and hide by placing logs in the stream. Jason explains, "Think of the stream as a treadmill. Fish, like us, need to hop off the treadmill sometimes and rest. Pools are resting areas, so the fish are happy."

Initiated by Mainspring, the group is called Mountain Partners and was made possible by support from The Community Foundation of Western North Carolina, the Cherokee Preservation Foundation, and the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation. The members plan to formalize into an operational organization whose goals include interpreting and linking sites such as the Nikwasi and

WHEN TIM AND EMILY CAMPBELL from Sylva began discussing donating 900 acres of land they own in Yellow Creek Valley in Graham County, they turned to Mainspring.

Mainspring purchased the land in 2008 and developed a plan to restore the property. With help from the Cheoah Fund, Mainspring also developed a trail to Yellow Creek Falls, a popular put-in for paddlers.

In 2013, Mainspring sold the property to the Campbells, who placed a conservation easement on it and kept the trail open for public access.

"Mainspring staff suggested donating the property to the National Wild Turkey Federation (NWTF)." Tim says. "We met with their representatives and decided it would be a great fit."

NWTF plans to use the property for conservation education, mentored youth hunts and fishing, habitat demonstrations, and wildlife and forest management.

As supporters of both hunting and protection of wildlife habitat, the Campbells are glad the land will be put to good use. "None of this would have happened without Mainspring," Tim says. "I am glad that we could improve some of the most exceptional land in western North Carolina."

In Fall 2015, Mainspring sold the historic Vonnie West house to Daniel and Darlene Carey through Preservation North Carolina, a nonprofit dedicated to saving our state's historic buildings. Mainspring had owned the property, located in the Cowee-West's Mill Historic District in Macon County, since 2013. It's easy to see that the Careys have

already made significant improvements! They will continue to restore the house under the historic guidelines they developed with Preservation NC, as well as a 1920s post office that is also on the property.
